

The 25th Nagasaki International Festival - Guidelines for details of how to participate

All Participants (Group/Business)

- **Location of Booths** Placement of the booths will be determined by the 2023 Festival Organizers
- **Booth operating hours** 11:00 – 16:00 *No starting late or leaving early
- **Items and materials for the exhibitions**
 - ① Display of the information about an international cooperation/exchange organization's activity
 - ② Sale of fair-trade goods & handicrafts from overseas
 - ③ Sale of cooked food made with fair-trade ingredients
 - ④ Flea market, bazaar
 - ⑤ 'Try-out' corners (i.e., trying on traditional clothing, musical instruments, etc.)
 - ⑥ Display of the information about the activities a business engages in
 - ⑦ Display of items for sale by a business
 - ⑧ Other *Please consult with the organizer
- **Items which the Nagasaki International Association can provide (to each group):**
 - Up to 2 panel board - Size: 91 cm x 182 cm or 90 cm x 172 cm
 - Up to 8 chairs
 - Up to 2 desks - Size: 45 cm x 180 cm
- **Important reminder:**
 - The Food Sanitation Act prohibits the sale of homemade food or drinks.
 - The sale of alcoholic beverages without a license is prohibited. If you plan to sell alcohol, please be sure to submit a copy of your valid liquor license to the Nagasaki International Association.

International Cooperation/Exchange Organizations Planning to Hold the Above ②, ③ or ④

- Please make sure to also display your organization's activities (photographs, POP, etc.) to inform the festival guests of the purpose of your organization's activities and the process of producing products, etc.
(Example)
 - This folkcraft article was made in
 - Bread made with fair-trade dried fruit
 - In <country>, we are doing <organization's activity>, and this product was made by the children of that country.
- Keep your display of activity until the end of the festival (16:00) even if the items/goods have sold out.

- Sales of items produced by in cooperation with foreign and Japanese workers
